July 20 – 24, 2009: Introduction to Microeconomics

Dawn Schumilas, Lead Instructor: Edwards School of Business

This introductory course is designed for students who have never taken an economics class or who would like to refresh their understanding of how consumption and production decisions are made by individuals and firms. Major topics include the production possibilities curve, opportunity cost, supply and demand analysis, elasticity analysis and profit maximization in different market structures.

July 20 – 24, 2009: Introduction to Macroeconomics

This introductory course is designed for students who have never taken an economics class or who would like to refresh their understanding of key variables used to analyze a nation's economy. The course will familiarize students with how the economy is analyzed and how economic policy is used. Major topics include: GDP and economic growth, analysis of aggregate demand and supply, demand-pull and cost-push inflation, types of unemployment, relationship between interest rates and investment, monetary policy and fiscal policy, exchange rates and international trade.

July 27 – 31, 2009: Introduction to Statistics

This introductory course is designed for students that have not taken a statistics class before, or are interested in renewing their understanding of statistics. It will cover basic statistical concepts and common descriptive statistics such as means and variances. Basic principles of probability theory, random variables and hypothesis testing will also be covered. Grades will be pass/fail.
