About the Agreement

In 2014, the Edwards School of Business at the University of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT) signed a transfer agreement that will enable more Aboriginal students to attain university business degrees.

Graduate's of SIIT's one-year Business Certificate program (no longer offered) will qualify to transfer one year towards the four - year Bachelor of Commerce degree offered through the Edwards School of Business.

All applicants to Edwards will follow the USask transfer student admissions process. The annual admission deadline is **February 15th**. All applicants must ensure that original transcripts are sent directly from SIIT to the USask Transfer Credit Office.
